**Gregor Stojin**, Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Artificial Intelligence at the Council of Europe

Gregor Stojin is the elected Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Artificial Intelligence at the Council of Europe (CAHAI), which is tasked with examining the feasibility and potential elements of a legal framework for the development, design and application of artificial intelligence, based on Council of Europe's standards on human rights, democracy and the rule of law. He is a bar qualified lawyer (Ljubljana) with an LL.M. in International and Comparative Law and a specialization in Information Technology and Intellectual Property Law (Chicago Kent), and has extensive experience in the crossroads of technology, information, human rights and law, both from theoretical, practical and policy perspectives. Gregor has contributed to many acclaimed projects improving the effectiveness, quality and access to justice, primarily working with the Supreme Court of Slovenia since 2002. Gregor also served as the State Secretary at the Ministry of Justice of Slovenia, was a member of the national Statistical Council, is a member of the European Commission for the Efficiency of Justice (CEPEJ) and its CYBERJUST working group, and collaborates with various organisations on technology and information related policy issues and development.
