

Staying human in the time of digital transformation

Dan Podjed, PhD, is a Research Fellow at the Research Centre of the Slovenian Academy of Sciences and Arts, Associate Professor at the University of Ljubljana's Faculty of Arts and Senior Research Advisor at the Institute for Innovation and Development of the University of Ljubljana. He acted as Convenor of EASA Applied Anthropology Network from its inception in 2010 until 2018 and continues his involvement as one of the Executive Advisors of the network. In 2013 he was the founder and from 2013 to 2018 the organiser of the international event *Why the World Needs Anthropologists*, which has become the main meeting point for applied anthropologists in Europe and beyond.



He was recognized twice (2013, 2021) by the Slovenian Research Agency's Excellent in Science programme for his scientific work. In 2019, he published the acclaimed book *Seen*, in which he explained why we are increasingly observed and exposed with the help of smartphones and other devices. In 2020, his book *Indoor Anthropology* was published, in which he presented to the public how he came to know society and himself during the Covid-19 pandemic. In the book *Why the World Needs Anthropologists* (Routledge, 2021) he brought together the leading experts in the field to highlight the value of anthropology in today's world. In 2022 he published an edited volume, entitled *Invisible Life of Waste*, which is based on a comparative anthropological study in Ljubljana, Zagreb, Graz, Trieste, Oslo, and Dubai. Since 2020, he has been researching the consequences of isolation and loneliness in the independent research project *#StayHome* and has tried to understand the rise of *homo covidensis*, i.e. human of the Covid age.
